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# FAQs

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## Is accommodation/equipment provided?

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Students are requested to bring sleeping equipment to overnight in the woodland camp. Please note we are not able to guarantee any equipment to hire.

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## Can I sleep in a B&B/hotel?

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We do not recommend this. Due to the timetable of the course and the distance to the nearest accommodation we would suggest students stay within the woodland.

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## Can I bring raw food to BBQ?

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Again we do not recommend this. Whilst there may be more time to relax in the evenings, the meal breaks do not tend to allow for extensive raw meals.

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## Will I be able to hunt something live?

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For ethical and practical reasons we do not pursue live quarry on our Weekender or Huntsman courses. If this is something you wish to incorporate then please enquire about our Bespoke courses. We will only allow clients to pursue live quarry once they have proved they can do so responsibly.

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## What if I don't want to shoot?

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Not a problem. We can substitute a small number of the modules for another skill.

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## How do I get to the meeting point?

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We are a rural based course so car is advised but regular trains to a local station followed by a taxi are easily achieved.

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## What ages are suitable?

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All ages are welcome – we do not set a limit on age range but please specify when booking if you feel extra care will be needed.

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## How fit do I need to be?

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The courses do include a low-moderate level of exercise but this is not pressured so don't be put off. We can go at your pace!

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## Can I bring alcohol?

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We ask clients not to bring alcohol as it is not allowed in conjunction with shooting/knife-working and has not proven to be conducive to a positive camp atmosphere.

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## Are stag/hen parties allowed?

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We are happy to accommodate single-sex parties, however due to the content of the courses and the risks involved we have a strict no-alcohol policy on site.
